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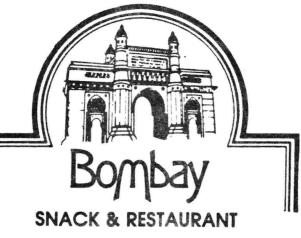

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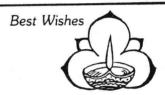

#### FIRST GOD, THEN THE WORLD

We are passing through a state of confusion, chaos and the most depressing feeling of rivalry, jealousy, hatred, and misunderstanding in almost all aspects of life. Never have we experienced so much poverty in the context of external abundance, so much loneliness in a crowded world and so much darkness within ourselves in the midst of the all-illuminating world outside. Our hearts cry out

Asoto ma Sadgamaya Tamaso ma Jyotirgamaya Mrityor ma Amritamhgamya:

From the unreal, lead me to the Real, From darkness, lead me to Light, From death, lead me to Immortality.

The modern crisis is essentially a spiritual crisis - the crisis of not realizing the Divinity in every living being, disregarding the great teaching "First God, then the World", not realizing that living in the World is not the same thing as letting the Worldliness live within you. Sri Ramakrishna puts it, "The boat will be on the water, but water should not be in the boat; that is dangerous for the journey". Sri Ramakrishna teaches us that every religion is a pathway to God and love and service to man is the same as love and service to God for God lives in the heart of man. He gives a simple example, "All the various pursuits of life are so many zeroes. Zeroes have no value in themselves, but when the figure "1" is put before them, they become full of values. That ONE is God. First God and then the World".

Conceiving God as the Divine Mother is the principal philosophy of Sakta religion. Many great personalities in India including the great philosopher Sankara, and Bhagawan Sri Ramakrishna were followers of this religion. To the Hindu, God is the Mother of all creations, called by different names such as Durga, Kali, Bhavani, Bhagawati, Annapurna or Minakshi. She represents a symbol of universal Motherhood who accepts everyone and rejects none. Our scriptures tell us that women are manifestations of the one Divine Mother and should be looked upon and treated as such with the utmost tenderness and respect. The Manu Smriti says, "From the point of view of reverence due, a teacher is tenfold

superior to a mere lecturer, a father a hundredfold to a teacher and a mother a thousandfold to a father".

Sri Ramakrishna worshipped the Deity as the Divine Mother of the Universe under the name Kali. His way of worship was unique. He would become unaware of his surroundings. The image of the Divine Mother for him was Mother Herself. He decorated Her with sandal paste and flower garlands and became so devoted to Her that he forgot everything. He spent days and nights in agonizing and passionate prayer and was finally blessed with the ultimate realization. The life and teachings of Sri Ramakrishna have a tremendous significance for the people of modern times. He demonstrated that the revelation of God takes place all times and that there is only one eternal religion of which different religions are but different manifestations to suit different temperaments. Like the different photographs of a building taken from different angles, different religions give us the picture of One Truth from different standpoints. As a result of his spiritual experience he came to the conclusion that there are not only many mansions in the Father's House, but there are also many doors leading thereto.

This world itself is a forest. The three robbers prowling here are Sattva, Rajas and Tamas - peaceful light, restless life and lifeless darkness. They rob a man of the knowledge of Truth. Tamas wants to destroy him. Rajas binds him to the world. Sattva rescues him from the clutches of Rajas and Tamas. Under the protection of Sattva, man is rescued from anger, passion and Tamas. But Sattva cannot give man the ultimate knowledge of Truth, though it shows him the road leading to the Spirit Supreme. Setting him on the path, Sattva tells him, "Look! There is your home".

Let me close with a prayer by Swamy Nisreyasananda:

"May the Lord of the Universe whom Ramakrishna realized in all his Glory but whom he chose to look upon as his Divine Mother, shower His choicest blessings upon you and your family and enable you to manifest the special qualification He has given you in the way you want to express it."

The more individuals capable of watching the world theater calmly and critically, the less danger of monumental mass stupidities - first of all, wars.

To hold our tongues when everyone is gossiping, to smile without hostility at people and institutions, to compensate for the shortage of love in the world with more love in small, private matters; to be more faithful in our work, to show greater patience, to forego the cheap revenge obtainable from mockery and criticism: all these are things we can do.

The call of death is also a call of love. Death becomes sweet when we say yes to it, when we accept it as one of the great and eternal forms of life and transformation.

Only in growing older do we see how rare beauty is and how miraculous it is that flowers can bloom in the midst of factories and cannon, that poetry can survive in the midst of newspapers and stock reports.

It is easy to transform time into money, just as electrical current can easily be transformed into light and heat. What is insane and ignoble about that stupidest of all maxims is the underlying assumption that "money" is a supreme value.

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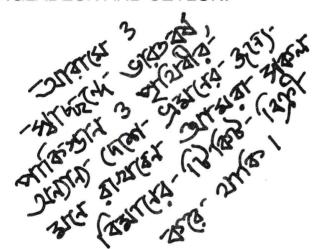
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
